



The Neuropsychology of ADHD in Childhood

The workshop

Recent advances in child neuropsychology have prompted the development of new theories of the nature of attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) in childhood.

This workshop aims to introduce participants to current neuropsychological theories of ADHD, in which its core deficits are understood to involve problems with the regulation and inhibition of behaviour, and the operation of the higher cognitive or executive functions.

The implications of this work for the assessment and diagnosis of ADHD will be examined, along with its implications for the design and implementation of effective interventions for the management of the behaviour of children with ADHD.

The presenter

Tim Hannan is a clinical psychologist and clinical neuropsychologist, who has been working with children and adolescents for 21 years. He is a Senior Lecturer in the School of Psychology at the University of Western Sydney, where he teaches in the areas of child clinical psychology, clinical and forensic neuropsychology, psychological assessment, and sport psychology. He was the Project Director for the 2003-06 Australian co-standardisation of the WISC-IV, WIAT-II and CELF-4.

Tim has completed postgraduate degrees in clinical psychology, clinical neuropsychology, cognitive science, and sport psychology. A member of the APS Colleges of Clinical Psychologists, Clinical Neuropsychologists, Forensic Psychologists, Educational & Developmental Psychologists and Sport Psychologists, he has served on national or state committees of each of these colleges, including terms as NSW Chair of the APS College of Clinical psychologists (1998-1999), and as National Chair of the APS College of Clinical Neuropsychologists (1999-2001), the APS College of Educational and Developmental Psychologists (2003-2005), and the APS College of Sport Psychologists (2008-2010).

Tim has lectured extensively on child clinical psychology and neuropsychology, and has presented lectures and workshops on these topics around the country and overseas. He has presented at each of the last eleven annual conferences of the APS on various topics in child clinical psychology and neuropsychology, and has been an invited presenter at numerous educational psychology conferences.
